








A national search is underway to attract an exceptionally qualified individual to serve as the Chief of Police for the Boise Police Department (BPD).

02 THE CITY


Boise, the capital city of Idaho, is a thriving community known for its vibrant arts and culture, bustling economic activity, and a strong sense of civic pride.

Supported by a six-member City Council, elected to represent various districts, the government structure promotes broad-based community involvement and transparent decision-making. Each council member serves part-time, focusing on legislative responsibilities and budget oversight, with a collective commitment to address the needs of a diverse urban population.

The government of Boise is deeply committed to fostering civic engagement, with public forums and council meetings that encourage active participation from residents. THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Boise Police Department is a cornerstone of the city's commitment to safety, transparency, and community engagement.

Staffed by nearly 400 dedicated personnel, including approximately 300 sworn officers and 100 civilian support staff, BPD focuses on protecting, serving, and leading Boise toward a safer tomorrow. The department is deeply integrated into the community, emphasizing a policing approach that reflects the values and diversity of the people it serves. With a budget of approximately \$95 million and a team committed to excellence in policing, community engagement, and innovative law enforcement practices, the department is committed to transparency and accountability, continuously seeking to build trust and cooperation with the community it serves. Officers are trained in de-escalation techniques and encouraged to participate in ongoing professional development to better serve the needs of Boise's population.

The Chief of Police is assisted by the executive staff, which is comprised of:

- The Deputy Chief of Police
- Five captains in charge of the Criminal Investigations Division, the Community Outreach Division, the Patrol Division, the Professional Standards Division, and the Training, Education and Development Division
- A civilian Chief Administrative Officer commands the Administration Division
- 16 lieutenants round out the command staff, responsible for various units and sections within the department

BPD is committed to openness and uses advanced data dashboards to provide the public with transparent access to crime statistics and trends, which helps in fostering public trust and informed community interactions. This initiative is part of BPD's broader effort to ensure safety and health across all Boise neighborhoods by encouraging public participation in understanding and shaping policing activities.

Through strategic use of technology and continuous engagement, BPD maintains a proactive stance on crime prevention, community education, and maintaining high standards of public safety. The department's approach to community policing is supported by ongoing training and professional development opportunities for its officers, ensuring they remain at the forefront of best practices in law enforcement.

06 QUALIFYING EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

The next Chief of Police for Boise will have a robust background in law enforcement, complemented by a strong educational foundation. Specific qualifications include:

- Experience: A minimum of ten years in law enforcement, with significant leadership experience in a municipal police department. A history of successful community engagement, business acumen, and collaborative problem-solving in a diverse community setting is essential.
- Education: A bachelor's degree in criminal justice, public administration, or a closely related field is required. A master's degree and completion of advanced law enforcement training programs, such as the FBI National Academy, are highly preferred.
- Must be capable of meeting the requirements established by the Idaho Peace Officer Standards and Training Council for certification.



The position of Chief of Police in Boise offers a competitive compensation package that reflects the significance and demands of the role. In addition to a salary range of \$190,000 - \$213,000, the city provides an extensive benefits package. This includes health insurance, retirement plans, professional development opportunities, and more. The city is committed to supporting the well-being and growth of its Chief of Police, ensuring they have the resources and support necessary to lead the department effectively.
